“The Invisible War: Depleted Uranium and the Politics of Radiation” —an exposé of the serious health dangers of “Depleted” Uranium (DU) to our military personnel and to civilians.

First in a series of community informational meetings and films on the subject of the U.S. use of depleted uranium weapons and the effects of exposure to it on our troops and on civilians.

DU is a radioactive weapon, and its use is a form of nuclear war. Hundreds of tons of it have been dropped, exploded, burned and vaporized in US theaters of war since 1991. American soldiers and Iraqi civilians have suffered dangerous exposure to DU.

DU shells were even recently discovered at a firing range on Oahu. Learn about and support House Resolution 2741 in Hawaii’s legislature this spring which requires good medical tests and follow-up for our returning service personnel who have been exposed to DU. Discussion to follow 1-hour film.
