While in Hiroshima, Clarke had a business called International House and facilitated many exchanges. She has worked with the Radiation Effects Research Foundation, the Quakers' Society of Friends, U.S.-China People's Friendship Association and many other peace groups and has lectured and taught in China at Shanxi University and in the US in Washington D.C. and U. of Pennsylvania.

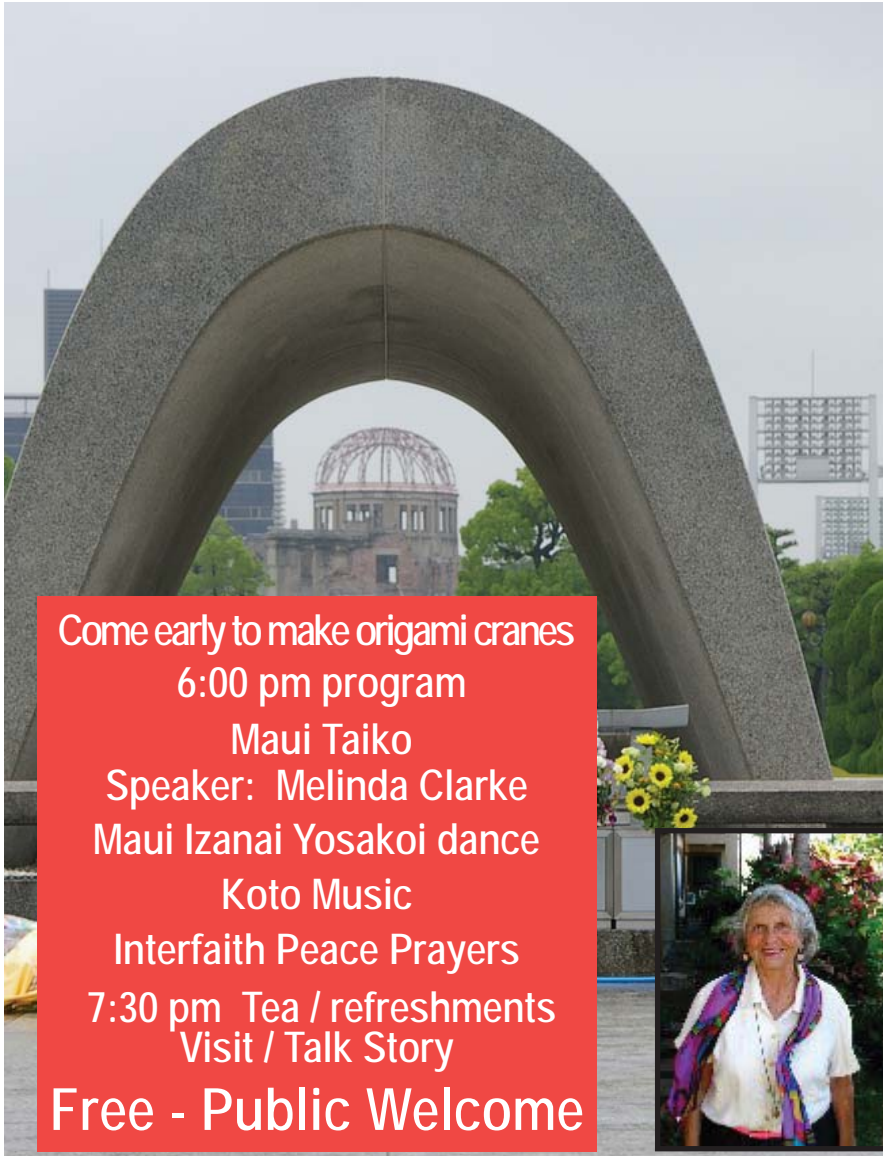
