When multiple warheads are detonated over Kansas and the U.S. missiles rise out of the silos to devastate another country, the main characters try to help the sick and wounded, communicate with what's left of the outside world, and defend their families.

The consequences of a nuclear missile strike were on the minds of all of Hawaii's people on January 13, this year. Maui Peace Action and the Hiroshima/Nagasaki Remembrance Committee urge the Maui community to think about the importance of preventing any future use of nuclear weapons.
